RESOLUTION TO RENEW THE ENGAGEMENT WITH CLEVELAND PUBLIC ART

WHEREAS,	The Board of Trustees of Cleveland Public Library receives a generous annual grant from the Cleveland Foundation from the Lockwood Thompson Memorial fund; and
WHEREAS,	One grant-defined goal stipulates, "The underwriting of expense in bringing to the Library for purpose of one or more lectures, one or more individuals in the field of literature or the visual arts"; and
WHEREAS,	In September 2004 Cleveland Public Library engaged Cleveland Public Art to organize the Lockwood Thompson Spectrum Dialogue Series and related publication; and
WHEREAS,	Beginning in 2010, Cleveland Public Art will arrange the temporary art installation in the Eastman Garden; and

WHEREAS, Cleveland Public Art has presented the attached proposal for the sixth (6) Spectrum Dialogue Series to include one or two speaker programs/events and an art competition in 2010 at a cost not-to-exceed \$109,500; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That Cleveland Public Library engage Cleveland Public Art to organize and market its <u>Lockwood Thompson Spectrum Dialogue Series</u> with fees and reimbursable expenses for the sixth (6) year being charged to the <u>Lockwood Thompson Fund Account: 22892103-53710</u>.

Cleveland Public Art is honored to offer consulting services to Cleveland Public Library for both the 2010 **Spectrum Dialogues** and the *See Also* temporary art program.

At your request, we have enclosed an updated proposal and budget for the 2010 year which includes:

- Costs related to the dialogue series, including moderator, speaker(s), and additional expenses
- Temporary artwork in the Eastman Reading Garden
- Publication in 2011

For the 2010 program year CPA proposes a budget not to exceed \$95,500.00, unless authorized to do so in writing from Cleveland Public Library (please refer to attached proposal details). This budget includes \$18,000 in administration fees and \$77,500 in reimbursable expenses. A brief breakdown of the 2009 Civic Design & Inspired Infrastructure is outlined below:

Based on earlier conversations with Cleveland Public Library staff, we are presenting the attached program budget. In addition to the 2010 program costs and based on discussions with you and Pamela Eyerdam, Fine Arts & Special Collections Manager, we are proposing \$14,000 in expenditures that are investments in the future success of the See Also program. We welcome the opportunity to discuss this proposal with you in more detail.

Should the Cleveland Public Library accept this proposal, CPA requires that reimbursable expenses are paid to CPA within 30 days of submitting invoices and/or receipts. Also, CPA requests a payment schedule for the \$18,000 management fee of:

1.	Upon Signing	\$4,000
2.	After the Spectrum Dialogue event	\$5,000
3.	Upon installation of the See Also artwork	\$5,000
4.	Upon Delivery of 2010 Final Publication	\$4,000

The Spectrum Dialogue series has involved collaborations and partnerships with other local cultural institutions and has remained and will remain wholly free and open to the public. Additionally, the intent of See Also, an annual program that brings temporary public artwork to the Eastman Reading Garden, is to activate a beloved public space with artwork by emerging artists from the Great Lakes region.

The **Mission** of these programs is to reinforce the Cleveland Public Library's reputation as a national leader in providing the highest quality educational opportunities to all citizens of the City of Cleveland and its surrounding communities. Through the series, the library will continue to be known locally, nationally and internationally as a civic institution committed to its role as a forum for the sharing of ideas and knowledge. The mission of these programs will be to have the broadest impact on the largest audience possible. This has been and will continue to be achieved by both the attendance of the dialogues and the Eastman Reading Garden as well as by the creation of a publication from the dialogues of each year.
