

2011 SOUTH BRANCH PRINT CIRCULATION

Planning & Research was asked by Jaime Declet, South Branch Manager, to analyze the 2011 print circulation for South Branch by age level. He asked that print circulation be divided further into fiction and nonfiction categories, based on cataloging information. Print materials includes any items with the Item Category 1 set to Books. This report will inform his decisions about the South Branch discretionary spending for print materials in 2012.

According to the December 2011 Monthly Activity Report, prepared by Planning & Research for the Library Board of Trustees, South's total circulation for 2011 was 118,840. This number reflects items circulated directly from South, sent to other CPL locations, and sent to CLEVNET libraries. Of this number, print materials accounted for approximately 19% (23,018) of the total items circulated during 2011. To put this in perspective, video formats accounted for 59%, audio formats accounted for 12%, and magazines accounted for 9% of total circulation. When controlling for *direct* circulation of print items, meaning that the items were circulated by South branch staff, print circulation accounts for approximately 16% (17,016) of direct circulation in 2011 (108,818).

To further analyze the number of print items circulated, the total number was broken down by age group. During 2011, the total print circulation for adult (10,160) and juvenile (10,146) books was almost identical, with YA books (2,710) making up a smaller percentage of print circulation.



Print circulation was then broken down into fiction and nonfiction for each age group, with interesting results.

- For adult print materials, the circulation of nonfiction items slightly edged out fiction items, with **53%** (5,421) **nonfiction** and **47%** (4,739) **fiction** items making up the total number (10,160).
- For juvenile print materials, the fiction circulation (8,413) far outpaced the nonfiction circulation (1,733) for a breakdown of **85% fiction** and **15% nonfiction**.
- For YA print materials, **fiction was 94%** (2,530) of the total number (2,710). **Nonfiction was 6%** (180) of YA circulation in 2011.
